## Chamblee News Updates...

**Day To Honor Kay Packard** - Monday, September 22nd, 2008 was literally "Kay's Day" at Huntley Hills Park. A large crowd gathered at 10am to honor Kay Packard's twenty-five years of "extraordinary efforts to enhance the quality of life in our community," principally through the National Wildlife Federation. There was a planning of a special wax myrtle tree, Kay's favorite, to honor her. The event was hosted by Chamblee City Council Member Leslie Robson, NWF television personality David Mizejewski, Tom Reilly and Chamblee Mayor, Eric Clarkston. The smile on Kay's face reflected Chamblee's recognition that "**this community will always be the better for the influence that you've had within it.**"

**Peachtree Boulevard Improvements** – The portion of PIB that was within the city limits of Chamblee has been re-named to Peachtree Boulevard. There are plans for trees, benches, cross walks and traffic islands as well.

**The Beaver at Huntley Hills Park** - took down a lot of the Japanese Magnolias that lined the sidewalks of our park and he gnawed at the roots of several of the huge trees that line the creek. The banks of the creek are severely undercut from years of scouring by the waters of the creek and that is probably where the beaver lives. The city paid a wildlife relocater to try to humanely trap him/her/it but they weren't successful so he's still out there. Apparently beavers are next to impossible to capture, and very sensitive to relocation (something about heart attacks and needing to stay wet to regulate body temperatures) so the city couldn't sanction paying the trapper indefinitely when the odds were so strongly weighted against a successful outcome. Right now he seems to be inactive or he may have moved on.

**Traffic Calming Update** - Our Traffic Calming Committee is making lots of progress! Soon they will present plans for how we can slow down speeding cars and decrease cut-through traffic throughout the neighborhood. # Curves

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## Gardening with Kay.....

February, 2009

The Chamblee Community Wildlife Habitat is alive and well! Some of our newest HH habitats are Fran Dickey, Lila Moore and Tina Peavy. We can ALWAYS use more!

Now – what to do in the garden – my usual reminder for this time of year. February is pruning month. Cut back all grasses – including monkey grass, by the end of the month. A weed eater does well for small clumps. For several years we've had pruning programs and workshops on pruning. For those who haven't attended, this is the time to trim back hollies, roses and all summer-blooming shrubs. Spring bloomers such as weigelia, forsythia and azaleas, should be cut back right after they bloom – not now! I can send you a handout or so on pruning if you will contact me at [kpackard@bellsouth.net](mailto:kpackard@bellsouth.net).

Bulbs may bloom early and then be hit by cold, but they should recover nicely. Remember to keep all plants mulched well.

I've had one person tell me they already have bluebirds seeking their summer homes. This is the time of year for them to find a home, so be sure nest boxes are clean and that there is always fresh water available. Keep feeders full, as the natural seeds are almost gone. Watch for the beautiful flocks of cedar waxwings as they visit your hollies and other shrubs that may still have berries.

Remember – I am always available for your questions on wildlife and gardening. If I don't know the answer, I will find out! ..... Kay



## New State Law For General Contractors

Until recently, Georgia has been one of the few states where almost anyone with the ability to obtain a business license could act as a general contractor. There were no financial or educational standards to be met which led to notorious abuses in the building industry - especially in residential development. In 2005, the Georgia Legislation passed a new law that all Residential and General Contractors MUST be State licensed in order to practice. The law established a Licensing Board and minimum professional standards. Those contractors unable to be "grandfathered" in must now qualify for the state exam and meet the insurance and credit requirements, along with stipulated amounts of accredited college education in construction, engineering and business fields or equivalent construction experience.

Four main types of contractor licenses were created by the Board, based on the type of work performed:

- **Residential-Basic Contractor** (*one and two-family detached houses and townhomes three stories or less*)
- **Residential-Light Commercial Contractor** (*multifamily and multi-use light commercial buildings/structures*)
- **General Contractor-Limited Tier** (*private, public, institutional and industrial work up to \$500,000 in scope*)
- **General Contractor** (*unlimited commercial construction*)



**Effective as of July 1 of this year**, permits can only be issued to qualifying state licensed general contractors, with some limited exceptions for specialty contractors, such as, graders, masons, carpenters, framers, roofers, etc. A list of exempted traditional and specialty contractors can be found at [www.sos.state.ga.us/plb/contractors](http://www.sos.state.ga.us/plb/contractors). Electricians, Plumbers and Conditioned Air (HVAC) contractors have been State licensed for years.

### What Does This Mean To Commercial Businesses?

Despite all the attempts to advertise the new law, there still are many contractors who are unaware of the regulations. If your business is planning any renovations or additions, be sure that the General Contractors you get bids from have their State License. Request a copy of their license or verify it online at: <https://secure.sos.state.ga.us/myverification>. Note that the licenses are issued to a person - not the company.

### How About Residents?

Homeowners may still act as the General Contractor to permit work at their own home, if they choose to do so, and coordinate the licensed and un-licensed trades needed for the job and call for the required

inspections. If you hire a General Contractor, he must have at least a **Residential-Basic** state license. Remember, to check with your local jurisdiction (Chamblee or DeKalb) regarding zoning and permitting requirements first. Chamblee requires permits for decks, fences, sheds, greenhouses, etc. and has zoning restrictions pertaining to those structures.

### Tips For Homeowners

1. Get recommendations from friends and neighbors and check with the local Permits Dept. before deciding on a contractor. Find out if they have worked in the community before and if there were any problems.
2. Ask for copies of their liability and worker's comp. insurance, state and business licenses.
3. Obtain a written contract detailing all work to be done, materials to be used, and final clean-up details. Include a completion date and payment schedule.
4. NEVER pay the entire cost of a project before the work is complete. A significant portion of the payment should be held until the final inspection and a Certificate of Occupancy or Completion is issued.
5. Avoid hiring persons going door-to-door selling services or offering services for a short time only or who refuse or are reluctant to complete contracts in writing.

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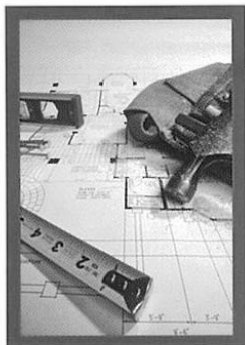

## Chamblee Annexation Town Hall Meeting

Monday, January 19, GA House Representatives Fran Millar and Mike Jacobs hosted a town hall meeting at the Chamblee United Methodist Church. The meeting was held to discuss issues regarding proposals for the annexation of two parcels into the City of Chamblee. Parcel 1 consists of the area east of Chamblee Dunwoody Rd north to I-285 and across to the existing Doraville and Chamblee city limits. This includes all of

Huntley Hills along with surrounding areas such as Gainsborough East, Rose Woods, Johnson Circle and various apartment and town home communities.

Parcel 2 consists of the area south of Hart Mill Rd over to Ashford Dunwoody Rd south back to Peachtree Blvd. This parcel is predominately the unincorporated section of Sexton Woods and the Peachtree Golf Course, but does include Blackburn Park and other smaller neighborhoods along Harts Mill Rd.

Reps. Millar and Jacobs shared their thoughts regarding the annexation of Huntley Hills and other neighborhoods into the City of Chamblee. Current Chamblee Mayor Eric Clarkson participated, noting that incorporation of the areas is generally a revenue neutral proposition for the city, but the startup costs could significantly impact the city's reserves. Start-up costs would be items like equipment (trash trucks, police cars) as well as additional support staff (police

officers, sanitation). The city would have to fund these costs without the ability to collect the new tax revenues from these areas.

Rep. Jacobs who represents the Sexton Woods neighborhood noted that he is generally opposed to moving forward with Parcel 2 at this time. He expressed concern that the annexation of this parcel not be rushed and that the overall impact upon DeKalb County's tax base and the services to surrounding communities be considered. He also expressed a longer term vision for a possible "City of Brookhaven" that might encompass the lower part of Sexton Woods under review for incorporation into Chamblee. Jacobs committed to conducting a survey of the Sexton Woods area to gauge their opinions. While he has his concerns regarding Parcel 2, he is generally in favor of the Parcel 1 legislation moving forward.

Rep. Millar noted that he is supportive of Huntley Hills being incorporated into Chamblee and noted the past work of surveys and contacts from many interested homeowners in our community. He expressed a desire to move the Parcel 1 legislation as now rather than later. He plans to sponsor and introduce the Parcel 1 legislation to the DeKalb delegation in the coming weeks.

Nick Guerrero, chair of the HHNA Annexation Committee provided an update for the nearly 100 attendees. He noted that a survey of HH neighbors demonstrated 80+ percent support for annexation into the City. Reasons for support include increased police response, leaf and waste pickup and a sense of community. (Huntley Hills is currently about 728 homes with about 89 in the Chamblee city limits.). Mr. Guerrero noted that the most important issue at this time is getting support from the other DeKalb delegates because without their support there is no right to vote. He challenged those in attendance to begin contacting the other 17 state reps and 7 state senators not in attendance to encourage their support for the referendum.

Provided at least 10 state reps and 4 state senators from the DeKalb delegation support the legislation, the vote on annexation would most likely take place during the November 2010 gubernatorial election, the next planned election for this area. The delegation is unlikely to approve funding for a special election just for annexation.
